After graduating from the Evergreen State College in Olympia, WA, Laura spent a pioneering decade in Seattle's contemporary art world, serving as co-founder and director of On the Boards, Center on Contemporary Art, and the International Festival of Films by Women. She moved to Missoula, MT and became Executive Director of MAM in 1990. Laura guided MAM in developing emphasis on education and outreach while embarking upon improvements to its facility and collections care. In 1993 she steered the institution through AAM reaccreditation and transitioned MAM from a county agency to a private nonprofit, strengthening both the museum's independent governance and its position for growth.

Beginning in 2001 she shepherded the renovation and expansion of MAM's historic building to create accessibility, expanded educational facilities, and showcase the institution's modern and contemporary collections and exhibitions, including a gallery dedicated to Contemporary American Indian Art. MAM completed the successful \$5.3 million capital campaign in 2006 with support from local and state government, foundations, citizens, and businesses. MAM continues to implement strategies to reach new audiences and build cultural value in the community and region. Free access is at the heart of MAM's mission, and we activate it by offering inspiring exhibitions and programs to serve our community with compassion, all completely free!!
