



Reaching the Summit Together and Shining a Light on the Strength of Business and Community Collaborating with a Single Focus

Featured Program





After an awareness campaign was launched by the National Beer Wholesalers Association, the Montana Beer and Wine Distributors Association (MBWDA), led by Mike Markovich of Summit Beverage, sought local information on human trafficking.

Mike Markovich connected with Lowell Hochhalter and Carson Hochhalter of The Lifeguard Group (a nonprofit victim and survivor service provider in Missoula, MT). They provided eye-opening accounts of the occurrences throughout Montana and the nation.

Those insights ignited a passion and commitment to end this heinous crime affecting all areas of Montana. Rural and Urban. Highways and back alleys. Sons and daughters. Mothers and fathers. Friends and neighbors. Young and old. People from all walks of life have found themselves in seemingly inescapable situations. But, unlike what's depicted in the movie Taken, trafficking doesn't usually start with a kidnapping or large red flags provided by the trafficker to the victim. Instead, many traffickers are adept at finding just one vulnerability in another person and luring them under a facade of kindness, friendship, or love. And the rescue mission is often as simple as a kind gesture or brief phone call.

With the help of The Lifeguard Group's education, Mike Markovich and Debra Pitassy of the MBWDA formed the Sentinel Project. Within 90 days, they had a complete turnkey program ready to roll out to hundreds of beer and beverage personnel statewide. In just 30 minutes, these men and women could be armed with the knowledge to spot the signs and make the call to save a life.

The Sentinel Project later caught the attention of Montana's Attorney General Austin Knudsen, who announced a public-private partnership with the Sentinel Project and other statewide law enforcement agencies in 2021.



VOICE FOR BUSINESS Child Care Initiative

The Missoula Area Chamber of Commerce has been involved in addressing the need for increased quality, affordable child care for the past few years. In June 2021 the Missoula Area Chamber of Commerce's CEO was appointed by the Governor of Montana as Chairperson to the DPHHS Early Childhood Advisory Council. The statewide focus will be to strengthen support for child care providers. ARPA funding has been awarded locally to the YMCA and the Cold Spring Project. The Chamber is the connector to information and support for child care needs.

ARPA LATEST FUNDING

In August 2022 two local organizations received approval for the ARPA Grants:

- The Cold Springs model under United Way received 41% of the funding they requested: \$410,000.00.
- The Missoula YMCA received 100% of the funding they requested; \$784,000.00.

Congratulations to both organizations working to increase child care availability in Missoula.
